Welcome and Roll Call	Ray Fitzgerald called the meeting to order and welcomed attendees. reviewed

Introduction of New Co-	Ray introduced Dr. Julius Mullen, as the new co-chair of the SDOH Committee		
chair	who has spent the last two decades at Children and Families First focused on		
	brain science and trauma, mental health, youth, mentorship, and public

Approval of Minutes	Michelle Statham made a motion to approve the December meeting minutes,

Updates from other	DPQC: Chaired by Dr. Colmorgen and Dr. Umobi work to improve the care of		
DPQC	mothers and babies. It focuses on obstetrical blood loss management, pregnant		
	women with substance use disorder, and evidence-based clinical practices.		
	<ul> <li>Leah Jones provided updates on the Delaware Perinatal Quality</li> </ul>		
	Collaborative (DPQC) and its projects, including efforts to address		
	hypertension among pregnant women, neonatal opiate withdrawal		
	syndrome, and the effects of low-dose aspirin on preeclampsia1. She		
	also mentioned new grants and initiatives focused on perinatal women		
	with substance use disorders and postpartum care.		
	Well Woman Committee Update: The committee chaired by Tiffany Chalk and		
	Mona Liza Hamlin will continue to focus on comprehensive and evidence-based		
	approaches to reproductive health and the health of women before, during, and		



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Updates Housing	between pregnancies, as well as the persistent maternal health disparities experienced by Black birthing people.  Shaila Kapoor asked for clarification on the focus of the Well Woman Committee compared to the committee focused on pregnant women.  Leah Jones explained that the Well Woman Committee has been working on various educational initiatives aimed at women of reproductive age, including preconception health, mental health, access to care, managing chronic conditions, healthy eating, and activity. Leah also mentioned that the Well Woman Committee focuses on the fourth trimester, breastfeeding, maternal health warning signs, and the importance of community health workers. Leah confirmed that the Well Woman Committee's focus is broader and includes women across different phases of their reproductive life, not just pregnant women.
Workgroup recommendations	The DHMIC board approved the recommendations of the housing workgroup on March 17th. The discussion included the formation of a combined workgroup to address central intake and prioritization of pregnant women, as well as the incorporation of the SRAP program. The workgroup will meet monthly, starting in April, with the first meeting being in person and focused on central intake and the SRAP program. There was also a conversation about securing TANF funds for housing support for pregnant women. The meeting emphasized the urgency of launching the workgroup and the importance of securing funding to support the recommendations.
