Committee Updates	<p>Well Women and Black Maternal Health Committee</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Committee met April 30 and focused on Her Story 2.0, a continuation of the video series amplifying women's voices. A follow-up meeting was held to expand the project to include postpartum and substance use disorder awareness. The committee is also revising the Women's Life Plan, Teen Life Plan, and Man Up Plan. Feedback is invited from community partners using these tools. Positive feedback was received on the fatherhood panel at the recent DHMIC Summit. <p>Social Determinants of Health Committee</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Committee met March 26 and introduced Dr. Mullen as new co-chair. DHMIC Board approved a recommendation to prioritize pregnant women in housing programs. Workgroup met May 9 and heard presentations from: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> CSG (consultants on centralized Section 8 lists) Delaware State Housing Authority (DSHA) on SRAP Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health (DSAMH) on voucher use in their programs Community Legal Aid Society on legal considerations Due to challenges with the Section 8 list, focus shifted to expanding access via SRAP vouchers. <p>Data Committee</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Committee reconvened with meetings on April 2 and May 7. Focused on understanding existing maternal and infant health data sources and identifying gaps. Developed new mission and vision to leverage and communicate timely, relevant data for improving outcomes. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Concerns raised about the CDC’s suspension of PRAMS and potential loss of equity-related data. Leah Jones (DPH) confirmed PRAMS is currently unstable at the federal level; the state is exploring in-house continuation using internal funding. Additional data sources under consideration: Medicaid and Healthy Women Healthy Babies program data. Emily Katzman (ChristianaCare) encouraged collaboration and review of ACOG’s fourth trimester benchmarks for potential integration. 			
V. Organization Presentation	<p>The MotherSHIPP App</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Presented a federally funded app designed to support pregnant and parenting women with behavioral health challenges. Developed by a team with lived experience and tested in Philadelphia. Key features: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Weekly pregnancy and postpartum lessons Content on self-care, behavioral health, child development, and parenting Available in English and Spanish with accessibility considerations Recruitment in Philadelphia has been difficult due to social determinants like housing insecurity and phone access. Dr. Kaplan is exploring use of the app in Delaware with residential treatment centers. Expressed interest in future partnerships with Delaware-based healthcare and behavioral health providers.
